Foreword

Guru Granth Sahib is the most distinctive scripture in several ways. It claims no exclusiveness, hence does not prescribe any proselytization. It is also distinctive in another sense that it preserves the original compositions of the Sikh Gurus and also embodies spiritual wisdom of over five centuries from the times of Bhagat Jaidev, Baba Sheikh Farid to those of martyrdom of the ninth Guru, Tegh Bahadur.

In his Introduction to *The Sacred Writings of the Sikhs* first published by UNESCO in 1960, Dr. S. Radhakrishnan, philosopher President of India, pays rich tribute to the sacred writings contained in Guru Granth Sahib which teach us how to transcend barriers created in the name of caste, religion and territorial boundaries. While emphasising relevance of Guru Granth Sahib in the emerging world order, Arnold Toynbee writes:

“Mankind’s religious future may be obscure. Yet one thing can be foreseen. The living higher religions are going to influence each other more than ever before in the days of increasing communication between all parts of the world and all branches of the human race. In this coming religious debate, the Sikh religion and its scripture, the Adi Granth, will have something of special value to say to the rest of the world.”

We are fortunate that we had the privilege of celebrating quadricentenary of the installation of Guru Granth Sahib in the Golden Temple in 2004. Four years later, in 2008, tercentenary of Gurgaddi Divas was celebrated at home and abroad. This has been the most significant period in recent Sikh history so far as the Sikh scripture is concerned. A National Level Committee was formed by the Government of India, with the Prime Minister of India, as its Chairman. On this occasion, lectures, seminars and printing of books in different languages were arranged, to spread the essentially unifying message of Guru Granth Sahib.

Apart from celebrating functions in Darbar Sahib, Amritsar, and other historic places of the Sikh community, an International Seminar on ‘Guru Granth Sahib and its Context’ was arranged by Bhai Vir Singh Sahitya Sadan in the Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi in 2005, which was inaugurated by Dr. Manmohan Singh, then Prime Minister of India, in which scholars from all over India and abroad participated. Proceedings of this seminar edited by this writer were published by the Sadan. The National Institute of Panjab Studies took up a major project of locating, photographing and conserving valuable tangible heritage of the Sikhs. Based on fieldwork and research, the Institute published eight pictorial books under the ‘Punjab Heritage Series’. The second project, ‘Locating, Cataloguing and Digitizing rare Guru Granth Sahib Manuscripts’, was taken up by the Institute in connection with the tercentenary celebration of Gurgaddi Divas. With active support from like-minded institutions and individuals, the Institute has been able to digitize more than 300 rare Guru Granth Sahib Manuscripts. The Institute is now publishing *Shabad Guru : An Illustrated Catalogue of rare Guru Granth Sahib Manuscripts* in four volumes for which I congratulate Dr. Mohinder Singh and his team for the patience, perseverance and dedication.

National Institute of Panjab Studies with the sponsorship of National Mission for Manuscripts is engaged in publishing a four volume Descriptive Catalogue of Guru Granth Sahib Manuscripts. Three volumes have already been published. This fourth volume, like the previous ones, carries the historical details of the manuscripts along with photographs of the Mool Mantra as discovered in private collections and in public repositories and institutions.

Guru Granth Sahib is the holy book of the Sikhs. The first words of this holy book are "IK ONKAR" from the Japji Sahib, a hymn given by Guru Nanak Devji. Sikhs believe that the paths leading to that ONE ONKAR can be many but the final destination is the same. The Supreme ONKAR is universal for all and is above religion. Religion is the path to reach to that all pervasive Supreme One.

We hope that this four volume Catalogue with historical details and selected folios from nearly three hundred Guru Granth Sahib Birs would be of immense value to historians, scholars and devotees and would draw them towards further interest in discovering the relevance of Guru Nanak's philosophy in present times.

Introduction

While the Adi Granth was prepared by Guru Arjan Dev with Bhai Gurdas acting as its amanuensis, its origins can be traced to the days of Guru Nanak Dev. According to the popular accounts, upon his enlightenment after emergence from the rivulet Kali Bein, Guru Nanak Dev recited Moolmantra, the primal creed of the Sikh religion. From the Puratan Janamsakhi, we learn that during his odysseys, Guru Nanak Dev got some of his companions en route to scribe the hymns that he composed. Thus some of his devotees acted as scribes for recording the hymns. We learn that Majh ki Vaar and Sidh Gosht were scribed by Bhai Saido Gheeho, while Malar ki Vaar was scribed by Guru's devotees Hassu and Shihan. However, a systematic effort to locate, edit and include the hymns of the Gurus and other Bhaktas and Saints in one volume was made by Guru Arjan Dev, which came to be popularly known as Pothi (Sahib) and later (Adi) Granth. It came to be revered as Guru Granth Sahib upon its being declared the Guru Eternal by Guru Gobind Singh.

To emphasise the unity of humankind, Guru Nanak Dev laid great stress on reverence for Shabad which is manifestation of the Divine. Guru Nanak Dev composed Japji which describes the primal creed of the Sikh faith. At a time when the Indian society was divided because of barriers created in the name of caste and religion, Guru Nanak Dev gave a new message of hope by emphasising on the transcendental vision of the Ultimate. During his dialogue with the Sidhas he was asked, "Who is thy Guru, who thou art the follower?", the Guru replied, "The Word is the Guru and the mind (attuned to the Word) disciple". He described Shabad (Word) as revealed to him as the source which could unite the humanity. While Shabad has been defined in different traditions in different ways, in Sikh parlance it means Divine Word, revealed through hymns set to musical modes especially composed by the Gurus.

Growing popularity of the Sikh faith and gradual increase in the number of its followers led to the rival claimants to Guruship writing under the pen-name of Nanak and making all out efforts to popularize them. Therefore, it became important for Guru Arjan Dev to codify the genuine hymns and present them to the community of followers in an authenticated and authorized form. Since the bani of Guru Nanak Dev and his predecessors was available in the collection of Baba Mohan, popularly known as Mohan Pothian, Guru Arjan Dev sent Bhai Gurdas to obtain this collection for the Guru. However, Baba Mohan did not part with the pothis. Baba Buddha was therefore sent on the same mission, but the result was not different. Thereafter, Guru Arjan Dev himself went to Baba

Mohan's house. While Baba Mohan was sitting in the attic of his house in Goindwal, the Guru sang melodious hymns from the ground floor. The humility of the Guru greatly moved Baba Mohan who happily agreed to pass the Pothis on to him. Guru Arjan Dev also collected selections from the writings of Hindu and Muslim saints who were at the same spiritual wavelength as the Sikh Gurus. In this process, he was able to obtain hymns of Kabir, Farid, Namdev, Ravidas, Bhikhan and other saints, some of whom belonged to the so-called low castes.

To work on the volume, the Guru selected a serene spot in Ramsar, near Amritsar, and erected a tent which became his makeshift study for working on the Volume. When the Volume was completed, with Bhai Gurdas as its amanuensis, the Guru asked one of his devotees, Bhai Banno, to carry it to Lahore for binding. During the process of binding, Bhai Banno is believed to have made a copy of the scripture which came to be known as Banno Bir. The original Bir, which remained in the possession of Sodhi descendants of Dhir Mal, settled at Kartarpur (near Jalandhar in Panjab), came to be known as the Kartarpuri Bir.

The bound volume of the original Bir was taken from Ramsar to the newly built Harimandir Sahib in a procession with due respect and ceremonies befitting the installation. While Baba Buddha respectfully carried the Volume on his head, Guru Arjan Dev walked behind with a flywhisk as a mark of respect. They all marched barefoot and installed the Volume in the sanctum sanctorum of the Harimandir Sahib in August 1604.

Since printing or any other mode of making copies of the scripture was not available in those days, making handwritten copies of the Bir was considered an act of religious merit. Devotees spent months and years copying the Birs for the benefit of the congregation. However, a survey of some of the rare Guru Granth Sahib Birs pertaining to the 17th and 18th centuries shows that in spite of the Guru's disapproval of the Bano Bir, its copies were being made along-side those of the Kartarpuri Bir. As the Sodhis of Kartarpur refused to part with the original Volume called Kartarpuri Bir, Guru Gobind Singh, the tenth Guru, got another Bir prepared with Bhai Mani Singh as its amanuensis. As this was prepared at a place called Damdama it came to be popularly known as the Damdami Bir. Apart from the contents of Kartarpuri Bir, this Volume also included hymns of Guru Tegh Bahadur. Baba Deep Singh is believed to have prepared five copies of this Granth which were installed at what are now known as Panj Takhats, five seats of temporal authority of the Sikhs. It is this version of the Granth that provides the authentic text of the printed Guru Granth Sahib and consists of 1430 standard pages in addition to the index generally printed in one Volume by the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee, Amritsar. Before leaving for his heavenly abode in 1708 A.D. Guru Gobind Singh declared Granth Sahib as the Guru Eternal for the Sikhs.

As far as Guru Granth Sahib manuscripts are concerned, it has been an established practice of the scribes to compare their copies with the original Kartarpuri Bir, popularly called Vadda Granth (Big Book). It was believed that a Granth compared and corrected with the Vadda Granth becomes shudh (correct and acceptable). Those who did not have ac-

cess to the original Granth in Kartarpur did so by comparing their copies with any other reliable copy of the Book. Different hand-written copies of the Guru Granth Sahib came to be associated with the names of their scribes or places where they were prepared. Thus, apart from Kartarpuri, Banno and Damdami Bir, we also have Bahawalwali Bir, Lahori Bir, Pushkar Bir and the Bir associated with Jagna Brahman, who is mentioned by Bhai Gurdas among prominent Sikhs who died fighting for Guru Hargobind in the battle of Amritsar. In his latest book, *A Study of Guru Granth Sahib: Doctrine, Social Content, History, Structure and Status*, Prof. J. S. Grewal mentions about some rare Guru Granth Sahib Birs which pre-date the Kartarpuri Bir installed at the Harimandir Sahib, Amritsar, in 1604.

With the passage of time, hundreds of handwritten copies of the Guru Granth Sahib were prepared for installation in the Gurdwaras in different parts of India. With the rise of Sikhs to political power and establishment of Maharaja Ranjit Singh's rule in Punjab and patronage of eminent Pahari and Kashmiri artists and scribes, some of the most beautifully illustrated copies of the Guru Granth Sahib were created. We find many illuminated Birs with Islamic and Hindu influences available in different repositories. The Akal Takhat Sahib, Takhat Sri Kesgarh Sahib, Takhat Damdama Sahib, Takhat Patna Sahib, Takhat Sri Hazur Sahib, the Guru Nanak Dev University, the Punjabi University, Patiala, the National Museum, New Delhi, the Chief Khalsa Diwan, Amritsar, Bhai Vir Singh Sahitya Sadan, New Delhi, and some private families have a number of illuminated copies of Guru Granth Sahib manuscripts in their collections. The British Library, London, is also a rich repository of rare Guru Granth Sahib manuscripts including copy of the Kartarpuri Bir transcribed by Sodhi Sadhu Singh for presentation to Queen Victoria. The catalogues of Dr. J. F. Blumhardt and Dr. C. Shackle, also mention about some very valuable Guru Granth Sahib Birs in U.K.

While a large number of Guru Granth Sahib manuscripts, including some very rare ones such as the Kartarpuri Bir prepared under the direct supervision of Guru Arjan Dev, the Damdami Bir prepared under the direct supervision of Guru Gobind Singh and other copies with Mool Mantra inscribed in the hands of the Gurus are available, no comprehensive catalogue or any such account of the Guru Granth Sahib manuscripts was prepared and kept under the control of Akal Takhat or any other central Sikh authority. As a result, with the passage of time some of the rare Guru Granth Sahib Birs have either changed hands or simply disappeared. No one knows the fate of the first five copies of the Damdami Bir prepared by Baba Deep Singh and sent to different Takhats. Similarly one does not know for sure which is the Guru Granth manuscript, that was bestowed Guruship by Guru Gobind Singh before his death at Hazur Sahib, Nanded, in 1708 A.D.

While it is difficult to guess the exact number of Guru Granth Sahib manuscripts presently available whether copied from Kartarpuri, Banno or Damdami Birs, there are scholars who have tried to locate them and have worked on different Birs available with different institutions and individuals. A careful study of the works of these scholars shows that many of the rare manuscripts quoted in G. B. Singh's *Sri Guru*

Granth Sahib Dian Prachin Biran, published in 1944, are not traceable. With a view to creating awareness for the conservation of this precious tangible heritage of the Sikh community, the National Institute of Panjab Studies took up a major project of "Locating, Cataloguing and Digitizing rare Guru Granth Sahib Manuscripts" in different parts of India and abroad. In the course of our fieldwork we have been able to locate, catalogue and digitise nearly three hundred rare Guru Granth Sahib Birs in collaboration with Professor Sahib Singh Trust, for which we record our obligation to Prof. Manjit Singh and other trustees. In order to share the benefit of our field work with interested scholars, we have decided to bring out Shabad Guru: Illustrated Catalogue of Rare Guru Granth Sahib Manuscripts in four volumes giving basic information about rare Guru Granth Sahib manuscripts at home and abroad. This Catalogue carries historical details of available Guru Granth Sahib manuscripts along with reproduction of the Moolmantra and some pages of the manuscripts providing rare glimpses of sacred heritage of the Sikh community.

For the field work and publication of the catalogue we got financial support from the National Mission for Manuscripts and the Delhi Sikh Gurdwara Management Committee, New Delhi, which we gratefully acknowledge. We also wish to acknowledge the cooperation we received from the Shiromani Gurdwara Prabandhak Committee; Chief Khalsa Diwan; Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar; Punjabi University, Patiala; Panjab University, Chandigarh; Takhat Sri Harimandir Sahib, Patna; Takhat Sri Hazur Sahib, Nanded; Panjab Languages Department, Patiala; Panjab State Archives, Chandigarh and Bhai Vir Singh Sahitya Sadan, New Delhi and other institutions and individuals who allowed access to their collections. In the fourth volume we have included folios of some of the rare Guru Granth Sahib birs in the collection of the SGPC such as Shahidi bir, Zakhmi bir and Sunehri bir. This volume also includes few selected folios from the birs in Pakistan, Bangladesh and Nepal which are yet to be digitized. There are precious volumes in repositories of London, Paris and Tashkent which are yet to be digitized.

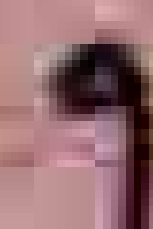

This Guru Granth Sahib Manuscript is placed at Gurdwara Hathi Bhata, Ajmer, Rajasthan.

This is a *Pothi* style manuscript with folio numbers running up to 806. On an average there are 21 lines on each side of the folio of the *Paath*. The *tatkara* has 26 folios with 25-26 lines in 2 columns. The folios of this manuscript have text border in two double lines with reddish orange colour filled in between the two double lines, making the text border thicker.

The Length/Width of this Guru Granth Sahib manuscript is 13"/13.5".

The handwriting is excellent in bold black ink. *Paath* starts on folio 2 and runs up to folio 806. There is one blank folio after index. Then there are eleven paintings on eleven different pages. The first ten paintings have been captioned with respective name of the Guru starting from Guru Nanak Sahib ji till Guru Gobind Singh ji. The eleventh painting which is without caption is the painting of Sri Guru Granth Sahib with

devotees in attendance. Both the pages of first folio of *Paath* have been beautifully decorated primarily in golden and red colour. On these two pages, lines of text have been written alternatively in golden and black colour. On the beginning of new *Raag*, there is a colourfully decorated vertical strip of about 4" wide carrying the moolmantar. These colourful decorated strips have been covered with the same size strip of paper stitched in the binding so that the colour does not leave a mark on the adjacent page. The manuscript is in good condition and appears to have been conserved. Text ends with *Raagmala*. *Siahi ki bidhi* has been explained after *Raagmala*. On some folios, there are lines of text written outside the text *hashia*. These are the missing lines from the *Paath* which seems to have been appended at the time of revision by the same scribe.

This Guru Granth Sahib Manuscript is placed at Gurdwara Sahib, Burhanpur, Madhya Pradesh.

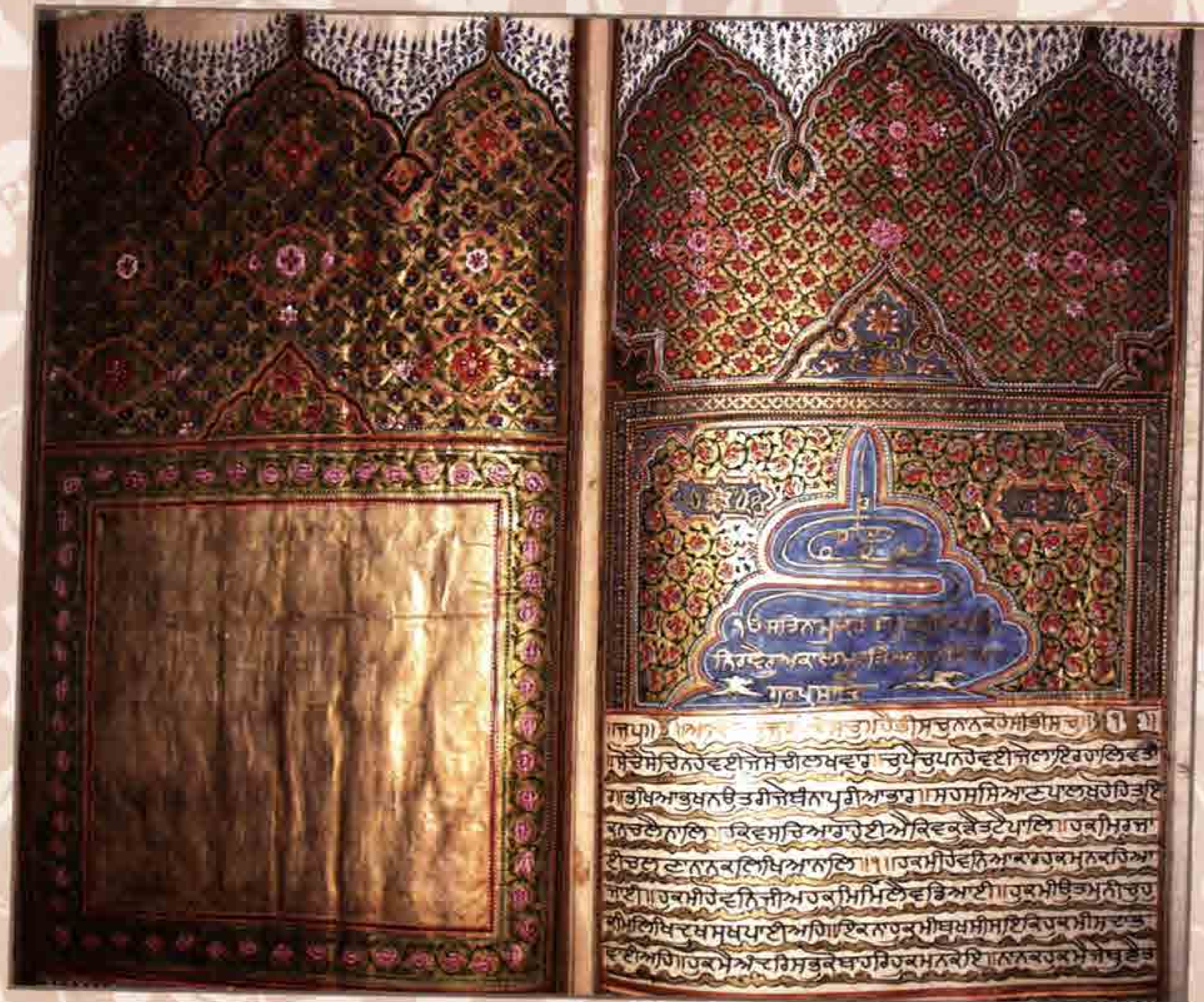
This is a *Pothi* style hardbound manuscript with folio numbers running up to 706. On an average there are 27 lines on each side of the folio of the *Paath*. The *tatkara* has 31 folios with 27 lines in 2 columns. The handwriting is excellent. There is use of black as well as red ink both in *tatkara* and *Paath*. On many folios, especially headings and sub-titles are in red. The folios of this manuscript have outer and inner *hashia* with multiple lines in various colours.

The Length/Width of this Guru Granth Sahib manuscript is 16"/14".

The folio before index is beautifully decorated. First folio of *Paath* is also very elegantly decorated. On the left side of the folio 32, *Challitter joti jot Samavna* has been given upto tenth guru, after which, the name of Baba Ajit Singh has also been appended. The right side of this folio depicts one coloured painting with its caption in Persian letters. In this *bir* there are folios with extra *bani* before *Raagmala*. *Siahi ki bidhi* has been explained on the last folio 706.

This Guru Granth Sahib Manuscript is placed at Gurdwara Sahib, Hoshangabad, Madhya Pradesh.

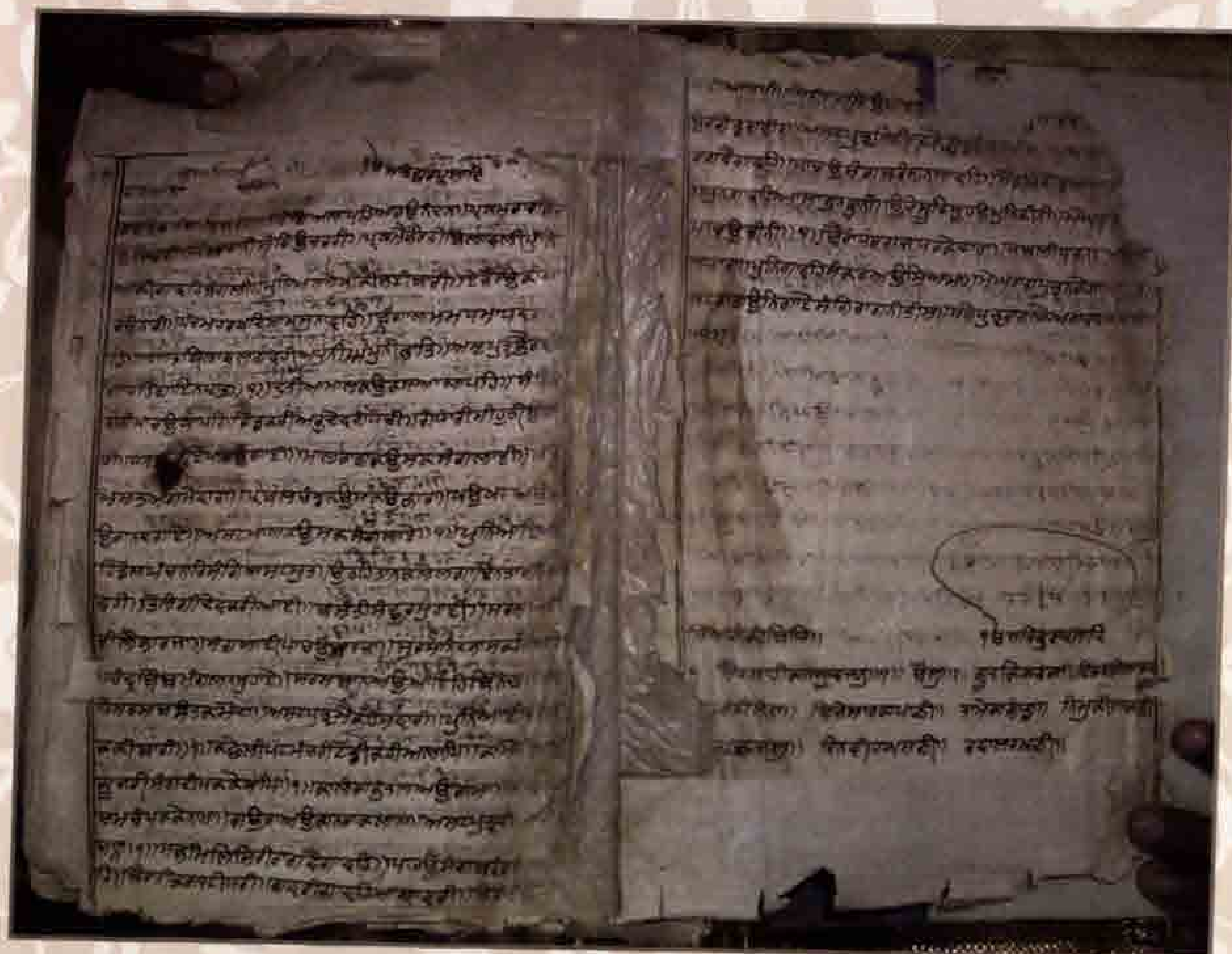
This is a hardbound *Pothi* style manuscript. *Tatkara* starts from the folio numbered 5. *Paath* starts on folio 41 and runs up to folio 797. There are 21 lines in general on each side of the folio. The *Tatkara* has 40 folios with 22 lines in 2 columns. Handwriting is reasonably good in black ink with more line spacing. Folios have inner and outer *hashia* with double lines in black colour.

The Length/Width of this Guru Granth Sahib manuscript is 14"/ 12".

Handwriting is reasonably good with more line spacing. All folios have marks of dampness. Towards the end of the manuscript, some pages are torn. Yellow *hartal* is used to hide the mistakes and the missed out text from the *Paath* is added in the margin area. One *shabad* of Meera Bai in *raag Maru* has been included in this manuscript on folio 611. Some extra *bani* has also been included before *Raagmala* on folio 797, followed by *Siahi ki bidhi*. *Challitter jot jot samavna* till 7th guru, Guru Har Rai has been mentioned on the last folio.

This Guru Granth Sahib Manuscript is placed at Vill.Kahangarh, Teh.Samana, Distt.Patiala, Punjab.

This is a hardbound *Bir* with a red cloth cover. The folio count is 687 with 24 lines in general on each side of the folio. The *tatkara* has 25 folios with 30-34 lines in 2 columns. The folios have inner and outer *hashia* with a black line in between two red lines.

The Length/Width of this Guru Granth Sahib manuscript is 15"/13".

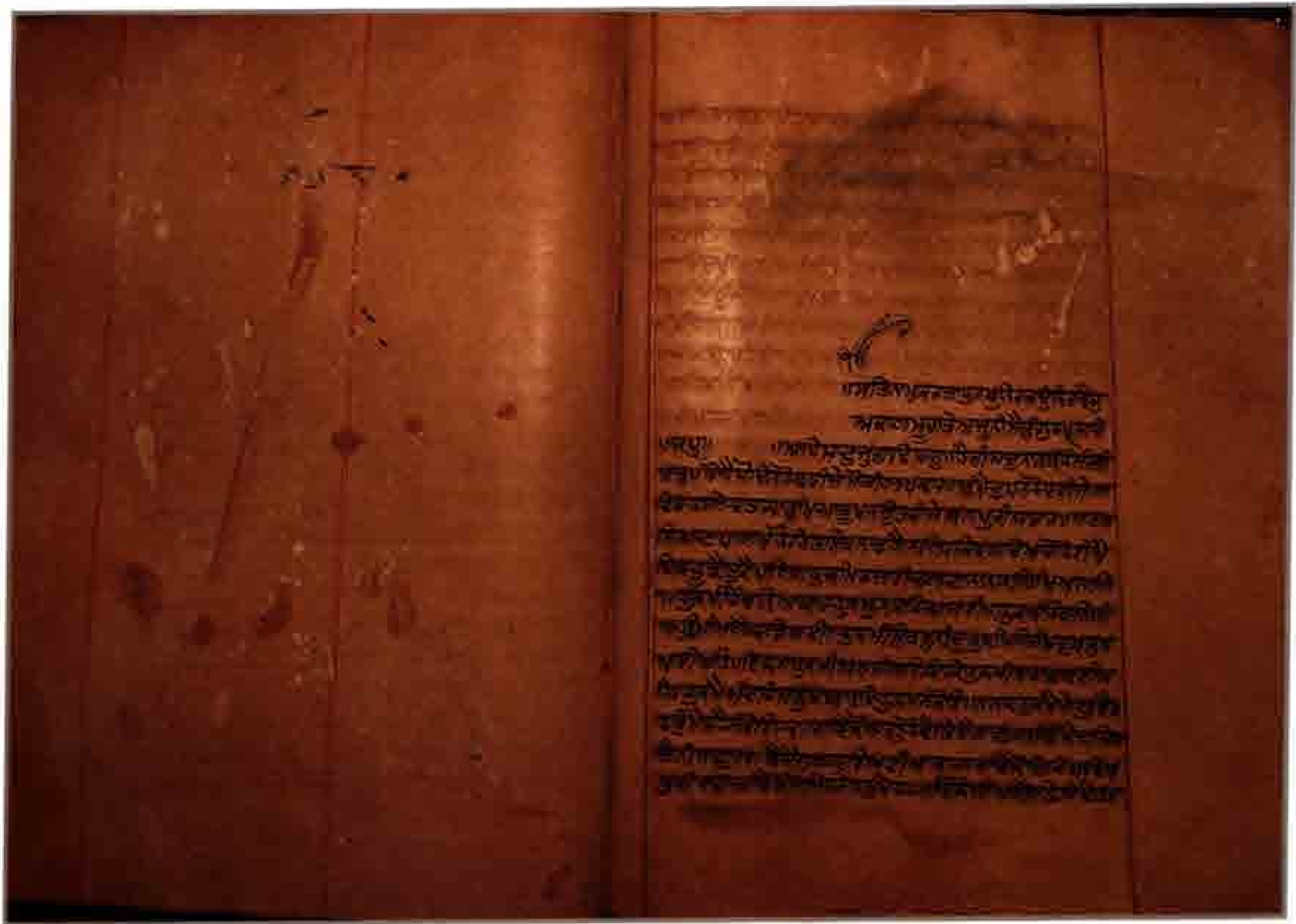
The hard binding has become old and fragile. Some of the initial folios are torn, damaged and have marks of dampness especially in the top margin area. The manuscript has got detached and unglued from the spine. Folios are numbered on the left top corner which

is generally on the right side. Handwriting is good and neat with equidistant line spacing in black ink. Except for the binding and initial *tatkara* folios, the condition of the manuscript is reasonably ok. The missed out text from the *Paath* is added in the margin area. This is an incomplete hardbound *Pothi* with cloth cover in blue colour. The folio count is 509 with a variation of 18 to 24 lines on each side of the folio. The *Paath* starts from folio 6 and ends at 484. The folios from 485 to 509 are blank. The *Pothi* does not contain *tatkara*. The folios have inner and outer *hashia* with double line in red and black colour.

The Length/Width of this *Pothi* is 12"/10".

The handwriting is good in black ink. The *Pothi* contains *Moolmantra* believed to be in the hand of Guru Hargobind on folio 476. In this *Pothi*, the bani of each Guru is beginning from a fresh page and the banis before *raag*

Jaitsri have not been mentioned. The first *bani Japji Sahib* of Guru Granth Sahib starts from folio 400. At few places, yellow colour *hartal* is used. Some folios have marks of dampness and paper of the folios look old and have turned brownish in colour. Some of the damaged folios have been tried to repair and conserve by pasting small strips of paper. At few places, even the writing ink has got smudged. The *Pothi* does not contain *bani* of ninth Guru, Guru Tegh Bahadur and even *Raagmala* has not been mentioned. It does not contain *Raag Jaijawanti*, *Siahi ki bidhi* and *Challitter joti jot Samavna* have not been mentioned.

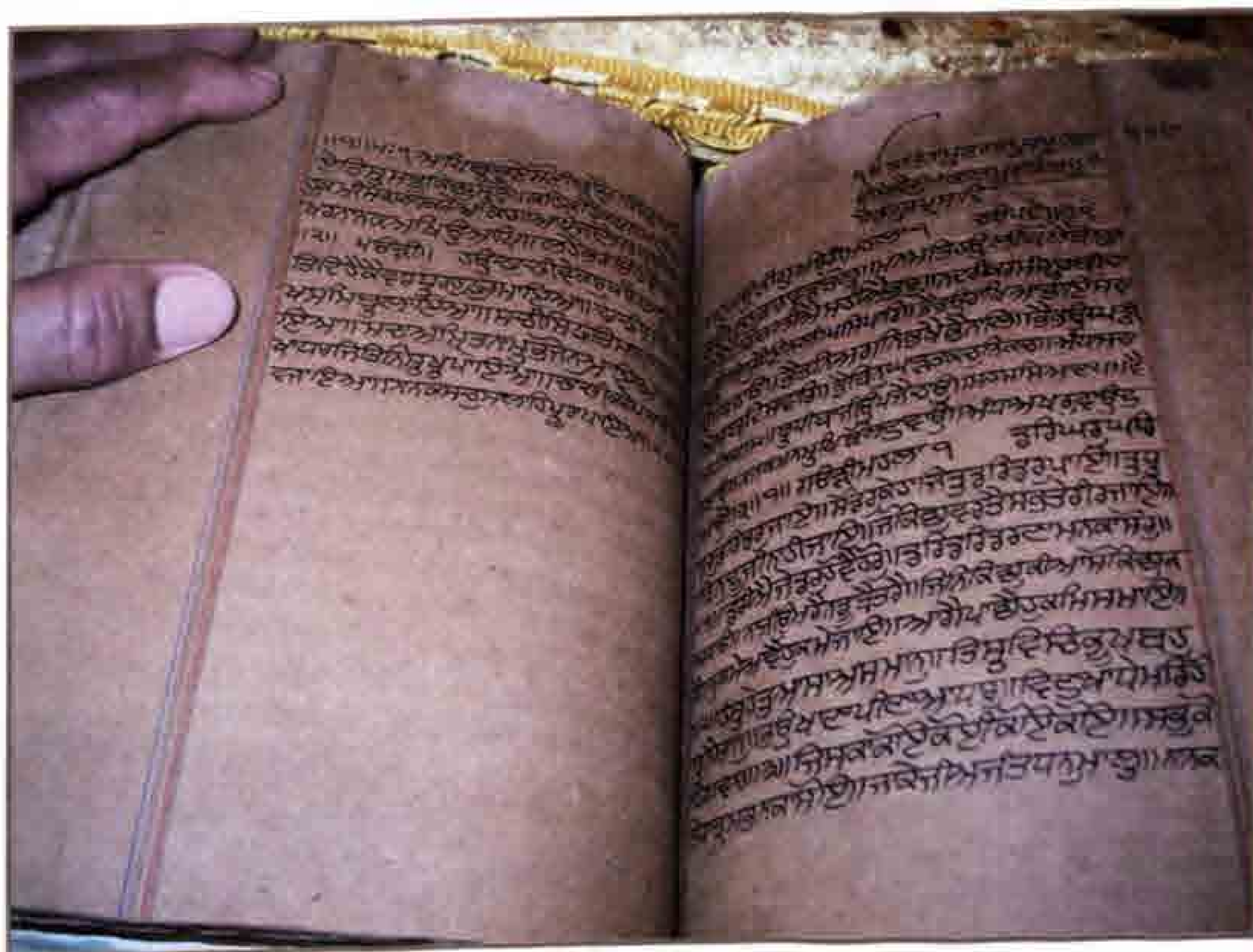

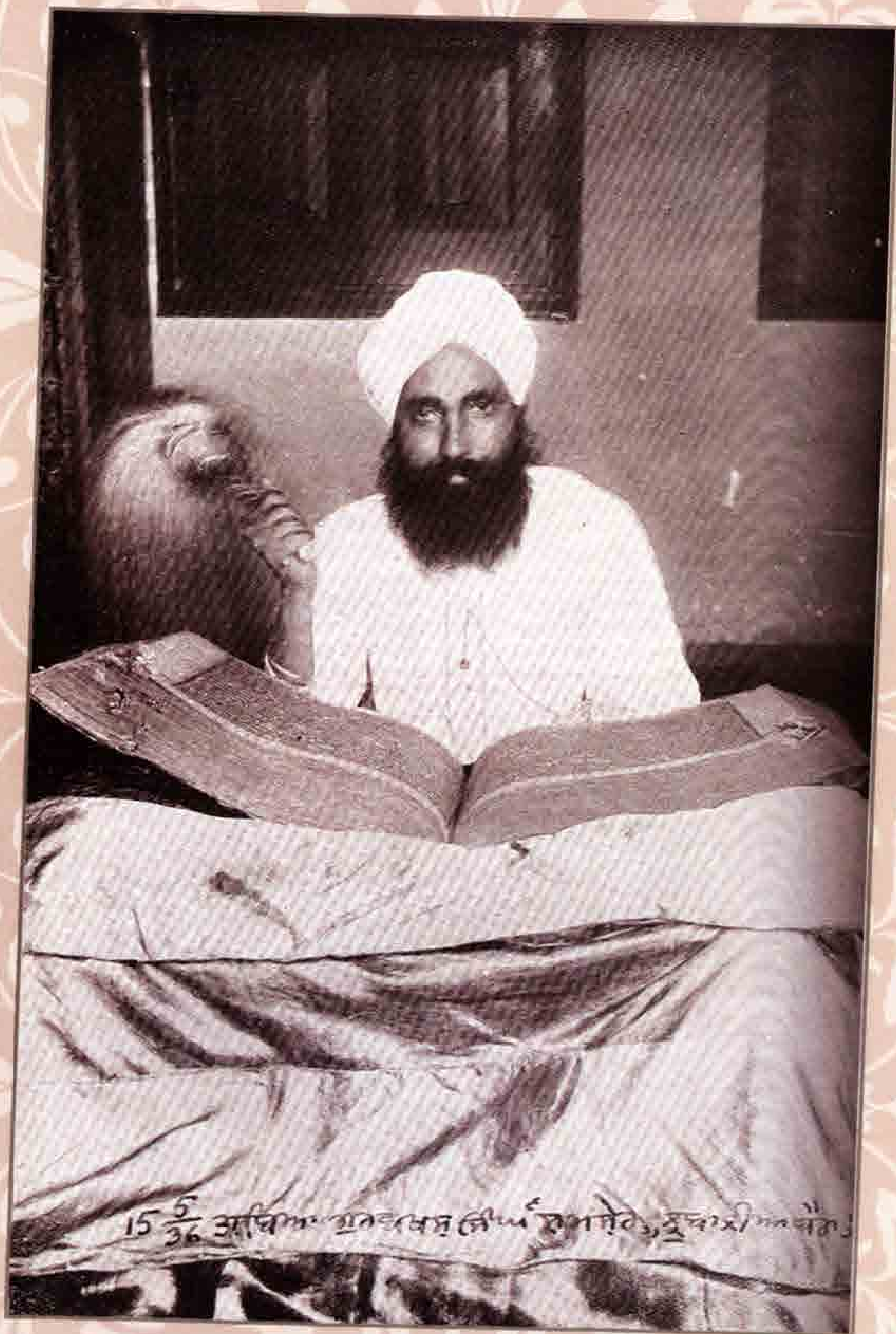

It is a hardbound manuscript with jacket type cover in orange colour containing 471 folios with 25 lines in general on each side of the folio. The *tatkara* has 21 folios with 29-30 lines in 3 columns. The manuscript is popularly known as *Zakhmi bir* as it got damaged during the Army action, operation Blue Star in Golden Temple, Amritsar in 1984.

The Length/Width of this Guru Granth Sahib manuscript is 13"/ 13½".

The handwriting is fairly good in black ink but the text is slightly congested with less

line spacing. The bullet mark is visible on the outer cover and about ninety folios of this *bir* were badly damaged due to firing in 1984 in the Golden Temple. Some of the damaged folios are conserved and repaired neatly by pasting small strips of fresh paper on the sides and edges. The *Paath* starts with *Ik Onkar...* *Moolmantra* and ends with *Athaaran dus bees*. The *Paath* ends with *Raagmala* on folio 471. At few places even the writing ink has got smudged. *Challitter joti jot Samavna* has not been given. *Siahi ki bidhi* has also not been explained.

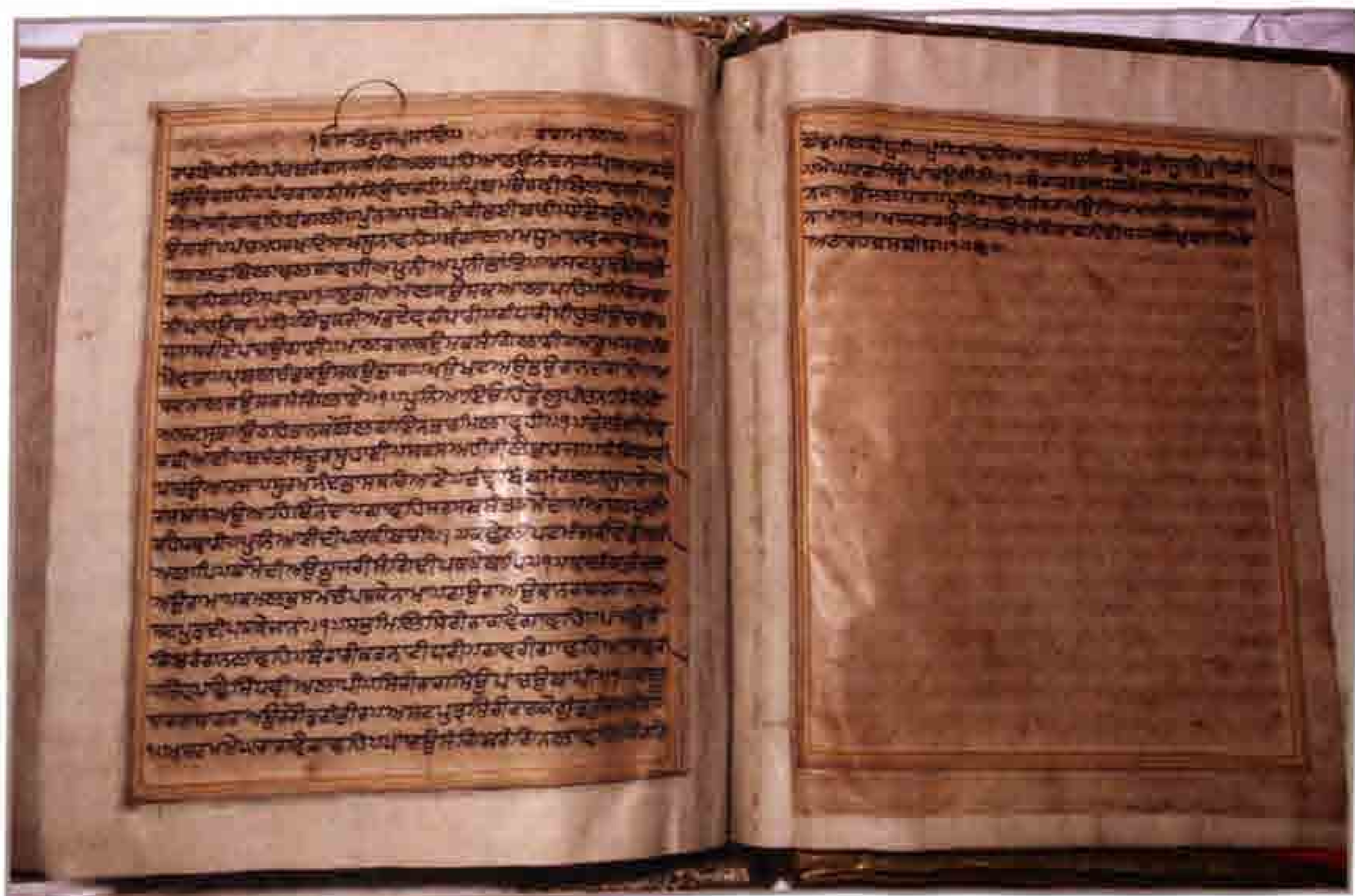

This Guru Granth Sahib manuscript is placed at Bhai Sahib Bhai Daya Singh Gurdwara, Dhawni Mohalla, Shahganj, Aurangabad, Maharashtra. This is a historic Gurdwara named after the first *Pyarey Bhai* Daya Singh. Guru Gobind Singh had sent Bhai Daya Singh to Aurangabad in 1706 to personally handover *Zafarnama* to Emperor Aurangzeb.

It is a hardbound manuscript with cloth cover in maroon colour. The *Paath* folios contain 19-20 lines in general on each side of the folio and *Tatkara* folios contain 23-25 lines in 2 columns. Folios have inner and outer *hashia* with a black line in between two red lines.

The handwriting is neat in black ink. After *Tatkara*, the *Paath* starts from the right side of folio 1 and the left side contains one colourful sketch type painting of Guru Nanak with Bala and Mardana. This miniature bears a caption "*Hasab Furmaish Bhai Wasava Singh*". In this manuscript, *Raag Jaijawanti* is mentioned on the 12th place in the series, which is generally on 31. *Raagmala* is not mentioned in *Tatkara Raagan ka*.

This is a historic Gurdwara named after the first Pyarey Bhai Daya Singh. Guru Gobind Singh had sent Bhai Daya Singh to Aurangabad in 1706 to give *Zafarnama* to Emperor Aurangzeb.

It is a hardbound *Pothi* style manuscript with cloth cover in dark orange colour. The folio count is 664 with 27 lines in general on each side of the folio. *Tatkara* contain folios with a variation of 27-35 lines in 2 columns. The folios contain inner and outer *hashia* with double line in red colour.

The handwriting is neat in black ink. *Paath* starts from Japji Sahib with 'Ik Onkar' written in a stylish way. In this *pothi*, *Raag Jaijawanti* is mentioned on the 12th place in the series, which is generally on 31. The writing style of 'Ik Onkar' is different on different folios with many curls and curves. Some extra bani has been included before *Raagmala* on folio 664 under the title *Ratanmala*, *Hakikat rah mukam raje Shivrabh ji ki*. As per *Tatkara*, *Siahi ki bidhi* is mentioned on the last folio.

This Guru Granth Sahib manuscript is a Damdami Bir believed to be given by Guru Gobind Singh to a family of Sawarda in Rajasthan in 1707 BS.

It is a hardbound manuscript with folio count as 722 containing 21 lines in general on each side of the folio. *Tatkara* contain folios with 30 lines in 2 columns. The folios have inner and outer *hashia* with a black line in between two red lines.

The *Paath* text starts from right side of folio 1 in triangular shape without any outline. The

handwriting is small and neat in black ink with less word and line spacing. Few beginning and end folios are badly damaged and even repaired by pasting strips of paper. On few damaged folios transparent salo tape is used for repairing so that the text remains legible. The text ends with *Raagmala* on last folio 722. *Challitter joti jot Samavna* has not been given. *Siahi ki bidhi* has also not been explained.

It is a hardbound big *Pothi* style manuscript. The folio count is 565 with 24 lines in general on each side of the folio. *Tatkara* contain folios with 40 lines in 4 columns. The folios have inner and outer *hashia* with double line in red colour.

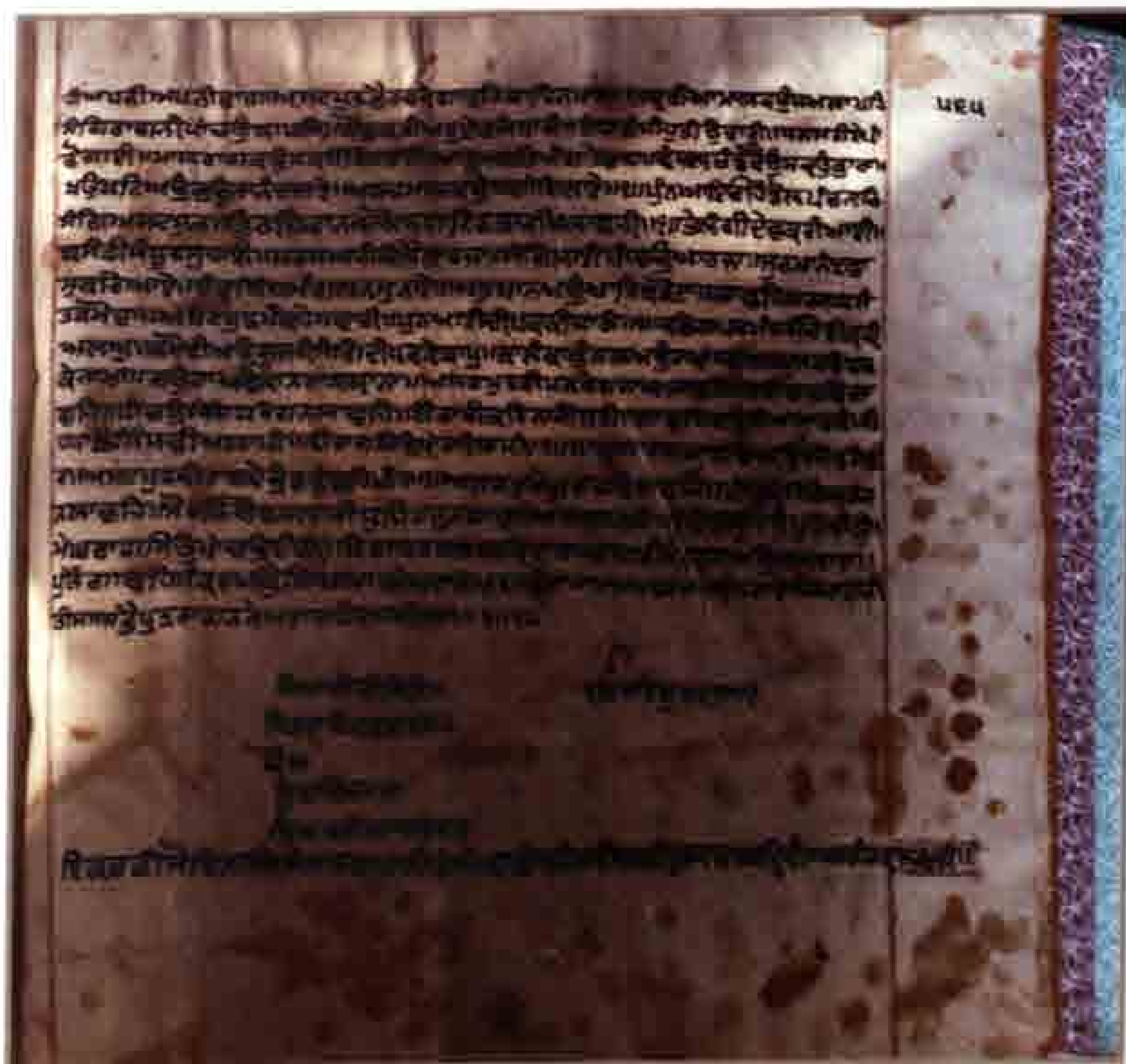
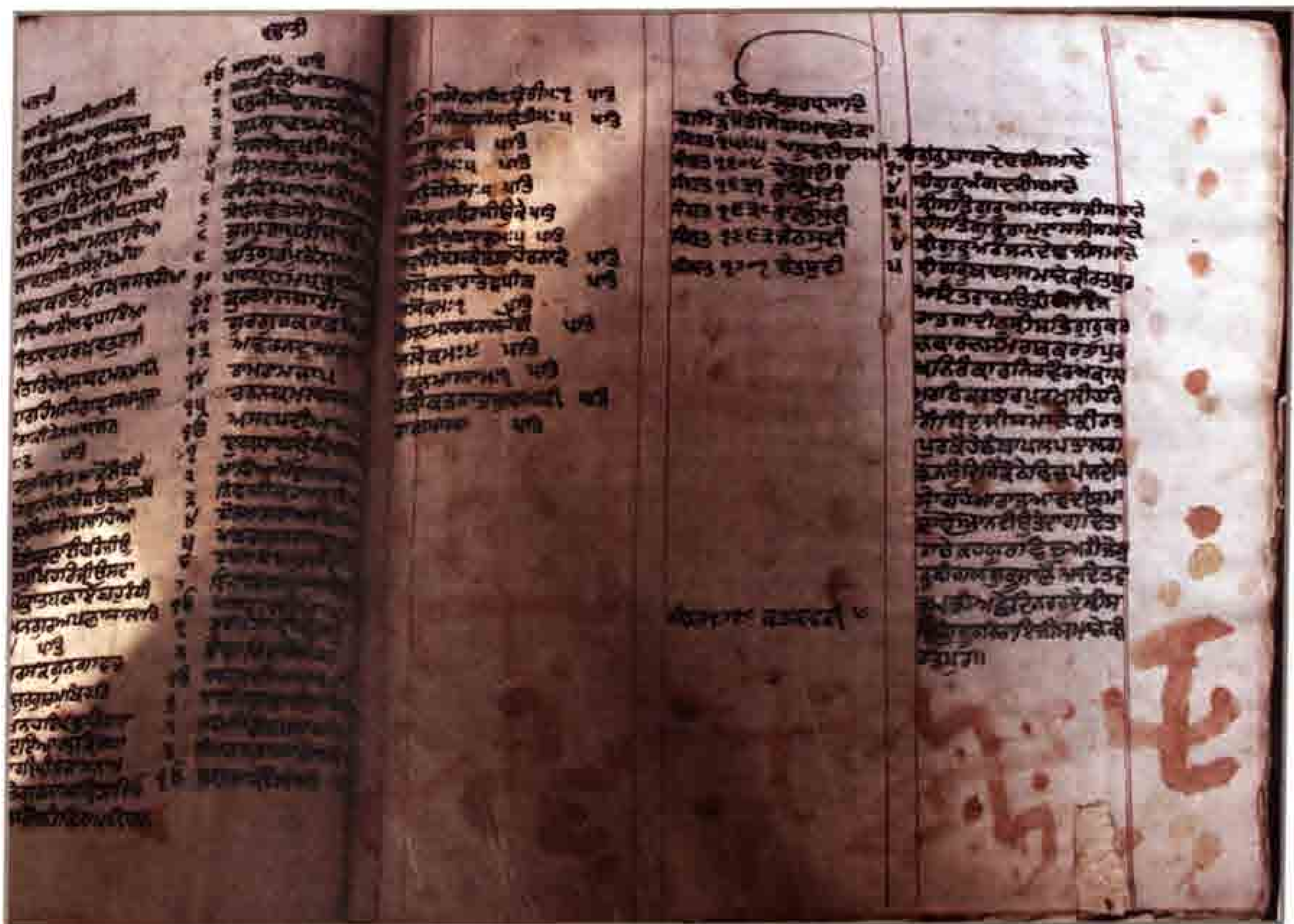
The handwriting is good. The overall condition of the manuscript is good. Some extra *bani* has

been included in this *Bir* after *Raagmala*. There are swastika symbol in light orange colour on the last folio. *Challitter joti jot Samavna* has been mentioned after *Talkara* till seventh Guru, Guru Har Rai. *Siahi ki bidhi* has been explained after *Raagmala* on folio 565.

This Guru Granth Sahib manuscript believed to have been scribed by Bhai Daya Singh and is placed at Gurdwara Mai Bhago, Bunga, Nanded, Maharashtra.

It is a hardbound manuscript with outer cover in maroon colour. The folio count is 661 with 21 lines in general on each side of the folio. *Tatkara* contain folios with 22 lines in 3 columns. The folios have inner and outer *hashia* with a double line in black colour.

The handwriting is very good in black ink with more line spacing. Few beginning folios are badly damaged especially from the bottom edges. Some folios have marks of dampness and on few the paper appears to have been

dissolved from the edges due to oldness, and wear and tear. The manuscript is in urgent need of conservation. Few folios have been tried to repair by pasting strips of fresh paper. The manuscript contains two colourful paintings, first, of Guru Nanak with Bala and Madana, and the second, of Guru Gobind Singh with few others. The text ends with *Raagmala* on last folio 661. *Challitter joti jot Samavna* has not been given. *Siahi ki bidhi* has also not been explained.

This Guru Granth Sahib manuscript is placed at Gurdwara Shri Mai Thaan Sahib, Mai Thaan Mohalla, Agra City, Uttar Pradesh.

Bhai Gurdas is said to have stayed at this Gurdwara when he composed his composition "Kabit Savaiye Bhai Gurdas".

The folios have colourful thick floral borders. The complete folio is filled with colourful floral patterns with the use of more of golden colour. The text is written in a small rectangular window in the centre of each page on each side

of the folio. One line of the text is with golden colour and the other is black and as such both the colours are alternatively used. The *Paath* folios contain 'Ik On kar.' *moolmantra* on every left page of the folio like a heading in a text box. The folios have 8 lines on left page and 14 lines on the right page. The condition of the manuscript is good.

This Guru Granth Sahib manuscript is placed at Gurdwara Shri Mai Thaan Sahib, Mai Thaan Mohalla, Agra City, Uttar Pradesh.

Bhai Gurdas is said to have stayed at this Gurdwara when he composed his composition "Kabit Savaiye Bhai Gurdas".

Tatkara starts from folio 1 and folios contain thick borders with multiple lines in orange colour filled in between red and black multiple lines. *Tatkara* has 20 lines in 2 columns on each side of the folio. Folios have similar text border as well as folio border with multiple lines in red, orange and black colours. Thick

orange colour is filled in between red and black multiple lines. Handwriting is good in black ink. The *moolmantra* 'Ik Onkar..' is written on top of every right side page of the folio. There are bunches of flowers made, using red, black, grey and white colours, on either side of 'Ik Onkar..' *moolmantra* on the top right page of every folio. *Hartal* is used to make corrections in the text. The condition of the manuscript is good.

This Guru Granth Sahib manuscript is placed safely with Raja Gulab Singh Sethi's family at Hanuman Road, New Delhi.

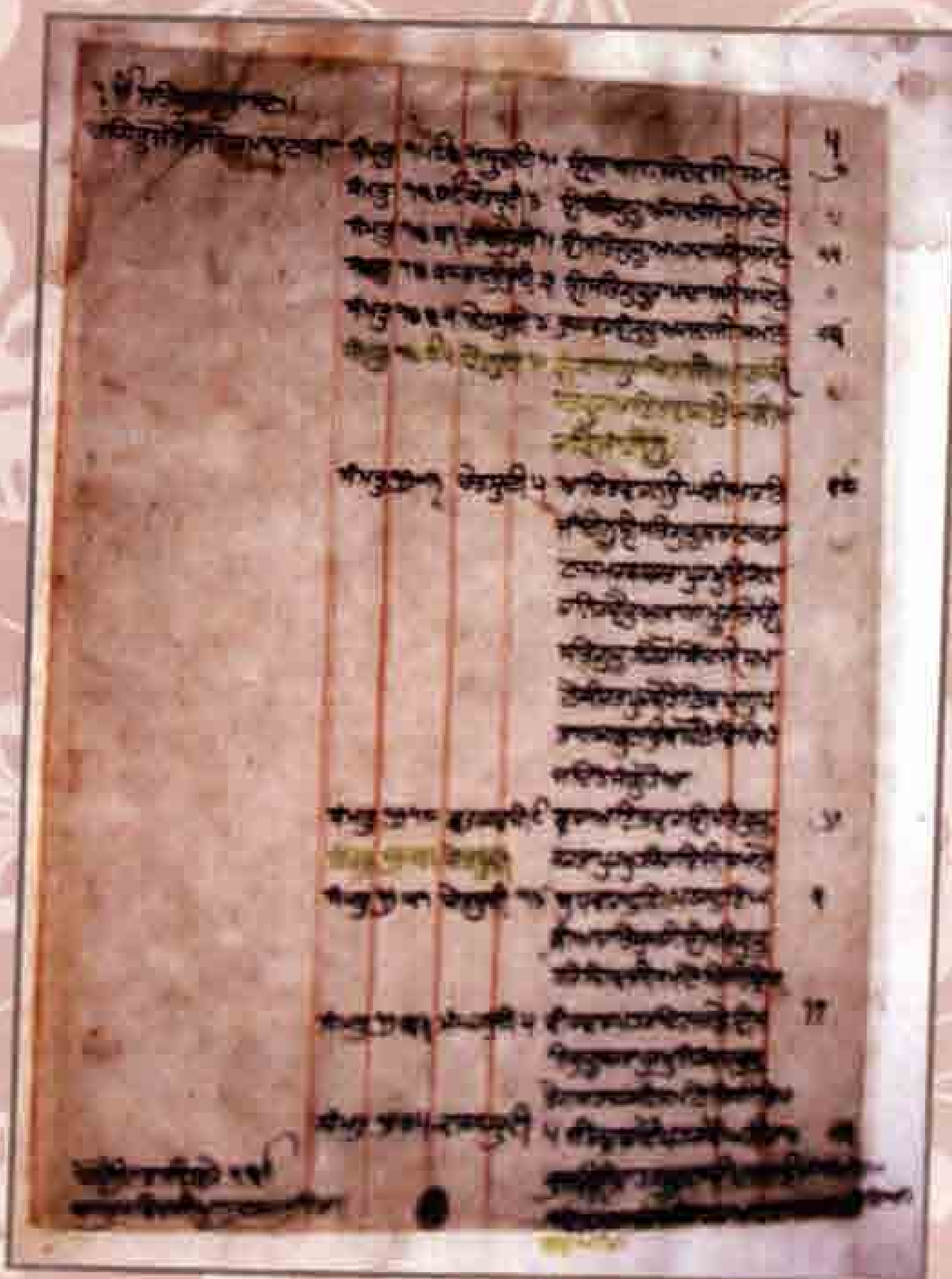
It is a hardbound copy of Bhai Mani Singh *Bir* with folio count as 1099 containing 24-25 lines in general on each side of the folio. *Tatkara* contain folios with 28 lines in 2 columns. The folios have inner and outer *hashia* with a double line in red colour.

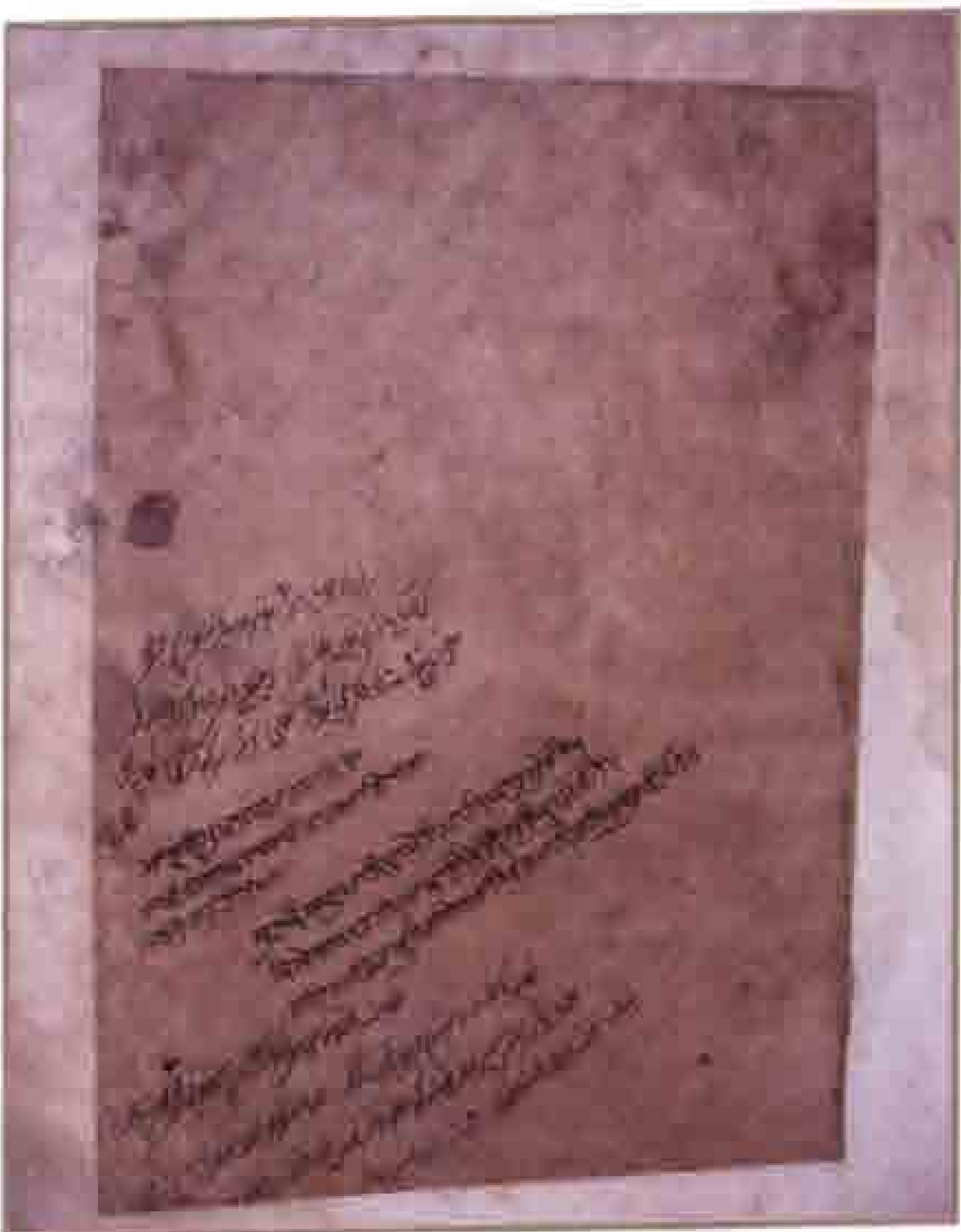
The handwriting is excellent with text properly formatted using black and red ink. The headings, full stops, numeric characters and closings are formatted using red colour. The overall condition of the manuscript is reasonably good except for some marks of dampness on the top margin area on few folios. The basis of *Tatkara* and *Bani* in this *Bir* is Gurus and Bhaktaas wise

which is a unique feature. To make it more clear, the *tatkara* first contains all the *Banis* of Guru Nanak in different *Raagas* and then the *Bani* of next Guru starts. *Paath* starts from folio 6 which is beautifully decorated with colourful floral borders. The word *Patshahi* is used everywhere in the place of *Mahalla* in this *Bir*. Folio nos. 1090 to 1095 contain some text in Persian script. Before *Raagmala* some extra *bani* has been included. Some selected *banis* from Dasam Granth have also been included in this *bir*. The text ends with *Raagmala* on folio 1092, followed by *Siahi ki bidhi*. *Challitter Joti Jot Samavna* has been given on folio 5 till tenth Guru, Guru Gobind Singh.

This *Bir* is a part of the digitised collection with the National Institute of Panjab Studies, Bhai Vir Singh Sahitya Sadan, New Delhi.

Paath : Verses in the scripture requiring reading or recitation.

Raagmala : Series of melody.

Raag : Melody.

Sakhi : Popular stories about the life of the Gurus.

Saloks : Stanzas.

Shabad : Hymns.

Siahi ki bidhi : Formula of preparing ink.

Tatkara : Index.





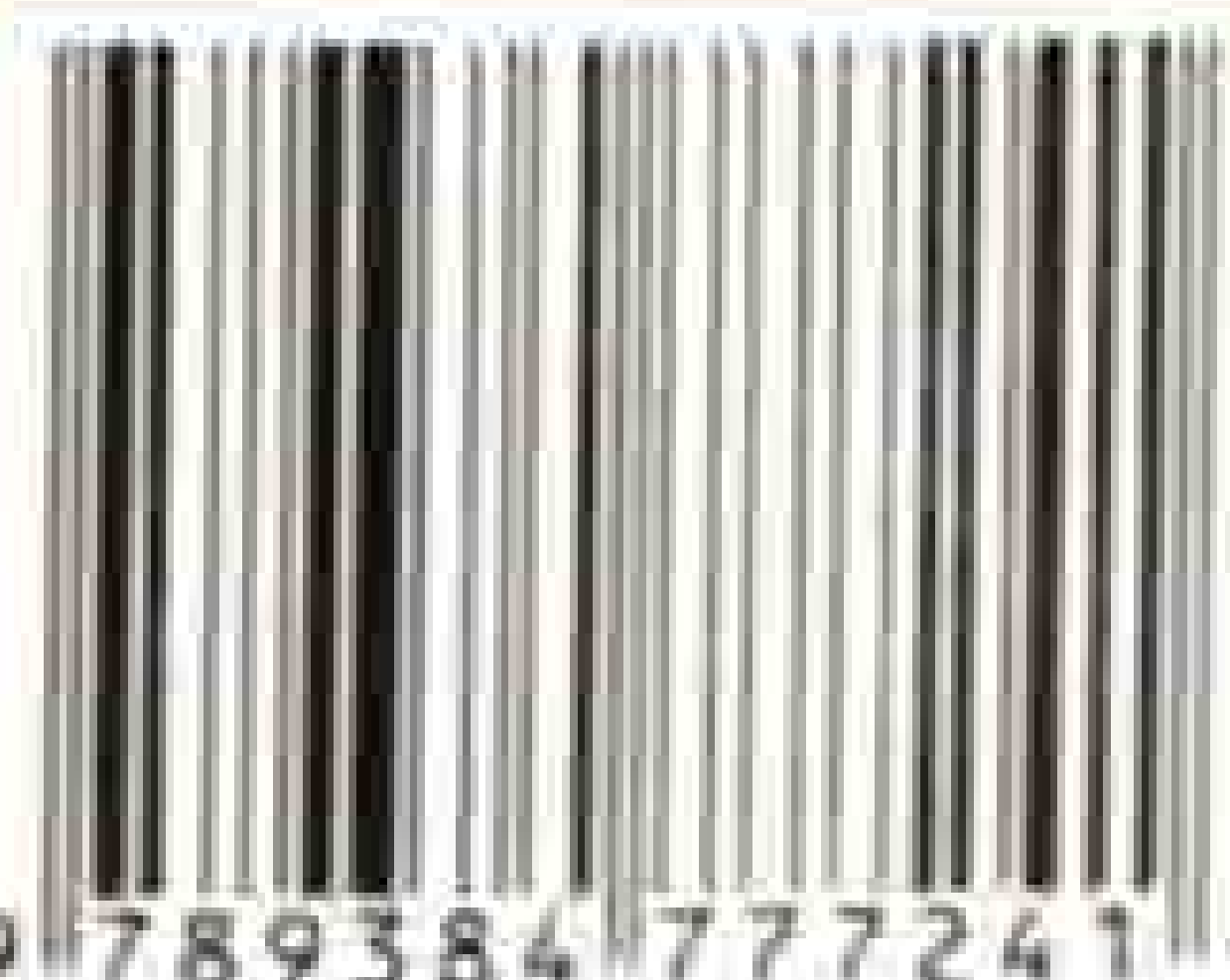
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
